

[Genesis] cont 16

Gen 19:4 But before they lay down, the men of the city, even the men of Sodom, compassed the house round, both old and young, all the people from every quarter.

19:5 And they called unto Lot, and said unto him, Where are the men which came into thee this night? bring them out unto us, that we may know them.

Gen 19:6-9 Lot refuses to send them out and offers his daughters instead.

Gen 19:10 But the men put forth their hand, and pulled Lot into the house to them, and shut to the door.

19:11 And they smote the men that were at the door with blindness...

Gen 19:12 The men tell Lot to leave this place with all that he had.

Gen 19:13 For we will destroy this place, because the cry of them is waxed great before the face of the LORD; and the LORD hath sent us to destroy it.

Gen 19:16 The men take Lot and his family, and set them out of the city.

Gen 19:17 ... Escape for thy life; look not behind thee, neither stay there in all the plain; escape to the mountain, lest thou be consumed.

[Genesis] cont 17

Gen 19:18-23 Lot escapes to a small city, Zoar.

Gen 19:24 Then the LORD rained upon Sodom and Gomorrah brimstone and fire from the LORD out of heaven.

19:25 And he overthrew those cities, and all the plain, and all the inhabitants of the cities, and that which grew upon the ground.

Gen 19:26 But his wife looked back from behind him, and she became a pillar of salt.

Gen 19:29 And it came to pass, when God destroyed the cities of the plain, that God remembered Abraham, and sent Lot out of the midst of the overthrow, when he overthrew the cities in which Lot dwelt.

Gen 19:30-35 Lot and his daughters lived in the mountain cave and his daughters tricked him.

Gen 19:36 Thus were both the daughters of Lot with child by their father.

Gen 19:37-38 Their sons become Moab and Ammon.

Gen 20 Abraham and Sarah travel to Gerar and tell King Abimelech that Sarah is his sister. God warns Abimelech that he has taken another man's wife. Sarah is restored to Abraham with 1,000 pieces of silver.

Gen 21:1-8 Isaac is born and circumcised

Gen 21:9-16 Hagar and Ishmael cast out

Gen 21:17-21 And God heard the voice of the lad; and the angel of God called to Hagar out of heaven...

Gen 21:18 And Abimelech left up the lad, and told him in this bond; for I will make him a great nation.

Gen 22 The offering of Isaac.

Gen 22:1 And it came to pass after these things, that God did tempt Abraham, and said unto him, Abraham: and he said, Behold, here I am.

Gen 22:2 And he said, Take now thy son, thine only son Isaac, whom thou lovest, and get thee into the land of Moriah; and offer him there for a burnt-offering upon one of the mountains, which I will tell thee of.

Gen 22:9 And they came to the place which God told him of; and Abraham built an altar there, and laid the wood in order, and bound Isaac his son, and laid him on the altar upon the wood.

Gen 22:10 And Abraham stretched forth his hand, and took the knife to slay his son.

Gen 22:11 And the angel of the LORD called unto him out of heaven, and said, Abraham, Abraham: and he said, here I am.

Gen 22:12 And he said, Lay not thine hand upon the lad, neither do thou say any thing unto him: for now I know that thou fearest God, seeing thou hast not withheld thy son, thine only son from me.

[Genesis] cont 19

Gen 23:1 And Sarah was an hundred and seven, and twenty years old: these were the years of the life of Sarah.

Gen 23:2 And Sarah died in Kirjath-arba; the same is Hebron in the land of Canaan; and Abraham came to mourn for Sarah, and to weep for her.

Gen 23:3 And Abraham stood up from before his dead, and spoke unto the sons of Heth, saying,

Gen 23:4 I am a stranger and sojourner with you: give me a possession of a burying place with you, that I may bury my dead out of my sight.

Gen 23:8 And he communed with them, saying, If it be your mind that I should bury my dead out of my sight; hear me and intreat for me unto Ephron the son of Zohar.

Gen 23:9 that he may give me the cave of Machpelah, which he hath, which is in the end of his field; for as much money as it is worth he shall give it me for a possession of a burying place amongst you.

Gen 23:14 And Ephron answered Abraham, saying unto him, My lord, hearken unto me: the land is worth four hundred shekels of silver; what is that betwixt me and thee? bury therefore thy dead.

Gen 23:16 ... and Abraham weighed to Ephron the silver, which he had named in the audience of the sons of Heth 400 shekels of silver, current money, with the merchant.
