

Genesis cont 36

Gen 41:1 And it came to pass at the end of two full years, that Pharaoh dreamed: and behold he stood by the river.

Gen 41:2-7 Seven well favored kings are eaten by the seven ill favored kine. Seven good stalks of corn are devoured by seven thin ears of corn.

Gen 41:8 And it came to pass in the morning that his spirit was troubled: and he sent and called for all the magicians of Egypt, and all the wise men thereof: and Pharaoh told them his dream; but there was none that could interpret them unto Pharaoh.

Gen 41:9-13 The chief Butler telle Pharaoh of Joseph.

Gen 41:15 And Pharaoh said unto Joseph, I have dreamed a dream, and there is none that can interpret it: and I have heard say of thee, that thou canst understand a dream to interpret it.

Gen 41:16 And Joseph answered Pharaoh, saying, it is not in me: GOD shall give Pharaoh an answer of peace.

Gen 41:25 And Joseph said unto Pharaoh, The dream of Pharaoh is one: GOD hath shewed Pharaoh what he is about to do.

Gen 41:29 Behold, there come seven years of great plenty throughout all the land of Egypt:

41:30 And there shall arise after them, seven years of famine.

Gen 41:33-34 Pharaoh appoints Joseph over all of Egypt. Food is gathered and stored, the 5/8th part is set aside.

Genesis cont 37

Gen 41:57 And all countries came into Egypt to Joseph for to buy corn; because that the famine was so sore in all lands.

Gen 42:1-2 Jacob sends his sons to Egypt to buy corn.

Gen 42:5 And the sons of Israel come to buy corn away; those that came: for the famine was in the land of Canaan.

Gen 42:6 And Joseph was the governor over the land, and he it was that sold to all the people of the land: and Joseph's brethren came, and bowed themselves before him with their faces to the earth.

Gen 42:8 And Joseph knew his brethren, but they knew not him.

Gen 42:9-13 Joseph sends his brother away with corn to return to Canaan and their father. He puts their money in the sacks of corn. Simeon is held captive for them to return with Benjamin, Joseph's brother.

Gen 43 Israel finally agrees to send Benjamin to Egypt, for the famine was sore in the land.

Gen 43:33-34 His brethren dine with Joseph.

Gen 44:1 And he commanded the steward of his house saying, Fill the men's sacks with food, as much as they can carry, and put every man's money in his sack's mouth.

Genesis cont 38

Gen 44:2 And put my cup, the silver cup, in the sack's mouth of the youngest, and his corn money. And he did according to the word Joseph had spoken.

Gen 44:3 As soon as the morning was light, the men were sent away, they and their asses.

Gen 44:4-11 Joseph instructs his steward to overtake them and find the cup.

Gen 44:12 And he searched and began at the eldest, and left at the youngest: and the cup was found in Benjamin's sack.

Gen 44:13 Then they rent their cloths, and looked every man his ass, and returned to the city.

Gen 44:15 And Joseph said unto them, What deed is this that ye have done?...

Gen 44:16-30 Judah explains how Benjamin came with them, only as a last resort over Jacob's wife. Joseph says Benjamin must remain as his servant.

Gen 44:31 I shall come to pass, when he (Jacob) seeth that the rod is not with me, that he will die.

Gen 44:33 Judah offers to remain as a servant; that Benjamin might return to his father.

Gen 45:1 Then Joseph could not refrain himself before all them that stood by him: and he cried, Cause every man to go out from me. And there stood no man with him, while Joseph made himself known to his brethren.

Genesis cont 39

Gen 45:2 And he wept aloud: and the Egyptians and the house of Pharaoh heard.

Gen 45:3 And Joseph said unto his brethren, I am Joseph; doth my father yet live? And his brethren could not answer him; for they were troubled at his presence.

Gen 45:7 And GOD hath put me before you to preserve you a posterity in the earth, and to save your lives by a great deliverance.

Gen 45:8 So now it was not you that sent me hither, but GOD: and he hath made me a father to Pharaoh, and lord of all his house, and a ruler throughout all Egypt.

Gen 45:9-17 Joseph sends his brethren home to get his father.

Gen 45:18 And Israel said, It is enough; Joseph my son is yet alive: I will go and see him before I die.

Gen 46:1 And Israel took his journey with all that he had, and came to Beer-sheba, and offered sacrifices unto the GOD of his father Isaac.

Gen 46:2 And GOD spake unto Israel in the vision of the night, and said, Jacob, Jacob. And he said, Here am I.

Gen 46:3 And HE said, I AM GOD, the GOD of thy father: fear not to go down into Egypt; for I will there make of thee a great nation.
