

Exodus cont. 24

Ex 32:10 Hear therefore let me alone, that my wrath may wax hot against them: and I will make of thee a great nation.

Ex 32:11 And Moses besought the LORD, his GOD, and said, LORD, ply not thy wrath upon me but against the people which thou hast brought forth out of the land of Egypt with great power, and with a mighty hand?

Ex 32:12 Wherefore should the Egyptians speak, and say, For mischief did he bring them out, to slay them in the mountains, and to consume them from the face of the earth? Turn from thy fierce wrath, and repent of this evil against thy people.

Ex 32:13 Remember Abraham, Isaac, and Israel, thy servants, to whom thou swearst by thine own self, and saidst unto them, I will multiply your seed as the stars of heaven...

Ex 32:14 And the LORD repented of the evil which HE thought to do unto HIS people.

Ex 32:15 And Moses turned, and went down from the mount, and the two tables of the testimony were in his hand: the tables were written on both their sides; on the one side and on the other were they written.

Ex 32:16 And the tables were the work of GOD, and the writing was the writing of GOD, graven upon the tables.

Exodus cont. 25

Ex 32:19 And it came to pass, as soon as he came nigh into the camp, that he saw the calf, and the dancing: and Moses' anger waxed hot, and he cast the tables out of his hands, and brake them beneath the mount.

Ex 32:26 Then Moses stood in the gate of the camp, and said, Who is on the LORD's side? let him come unto me. And all the sons of Levi gathered themselves together unto him.

Ex 32:27 And he said unto them, Thus saith the LORD GOD of Israel, Put every man his sword by his side, and go in and out from gate to gate throughout the camp, and slay every man his brother, and every man his companion, and every man his neighbour.

Ex 32:28 And the children of Levi did according to the word of Moses: and there fell of the people that day about three thousand men.

Ex 32:30-35 Moses prays for the people.

Ex 33:1-6 The LORD refuses to go with Israel.

Ex 33:2 And I will send an angel before thee, and I will drive out the Canaanite, the Amorite, and the Hittite, and the Perizzite, the Hivite, and the Jebusite:

Ex 33:3 Into a land flowing with milk and honey...

Exodus cont. 26

Ex 33:7-11 The tabernacle moved without the camp.

Ex 33:9 And it came to pass, as Moses entered into the tabernacle, the cloudy pillar descended, and stood at the door of the tabernacle, and the LORD talked with Moses.

Ex 33:11 And the LORD spake unto Moses face to face as a man speaketh unto his friend. ...

Ex 33:12-23 Moses desires to see the glory of GOD.

Ex 33:20 And HE said, Thou canst not see MY face: for thou shalt no man see ME and live.

Ex 33:21 And the LORD said, Behold there is a place by me, and thou shalt stand upon a rock.

Ex 33:22 And it shall come to pass while my glory passeth by, that I will put thee in a cleft of the rock, and will cover thee with my hand, while I pass by.

Ex 33:23 And I will take away mine hand, and thou shalt see my back parts: but my face shall not be seen.

Ex 34 The LORD provides a second set of tables of testimony.

Ex 34:10-27 GOD's covenant and festivals

Ex 34:28 And he was there with the LORD forty days and forty nights, he did eat neither bread nor drink, neither did he wash his face, the words of the covenant, the ten commandments.

Exodus cont. 27

Ex 34:28-35 Moses face shined after being in the presence of the Glory of GOD. He wore a vail when speaking with men.

Ex 34:34 But when Moses went in before the LORD to speak with HIM, he took the vail off, until he came out, and spoke unto the children of Israel that which he was commanded.

Ex 35 Moses reminds the people of the sabbath, and asks them to make an offering to the LORD, of all the things needed for the tabernacle and the ark of the covenant.

Ex 36 The tabernacle is constructed

Ex 37 The ark and altar are constructed

Ex 38 Construction of Sanctuary continues

Ex 39 The holy garments for Aaron

Ex 39:9... they made the broidered double: a span was the length thereof, and a span the breadth thereof, being doubled.

Ex 39:10 And they set in it four rows of stones: the first row was a sardius, a topaz, and a carbuncle: this was the first row.

Ex 39:11 And the second row, an emerald, a sapphire, and a diamond.

Ex 39:12 And the third row, a ligure, an agate, and an amethyst.

Ex 39:13 And the fourth row, a beryl, an onyx, and a jasper: they were inclosed in ounces of gold...
