

I Samuel 2-16-2018

I Sam - the history of Samuel, the last of the Judges.

I Sam 1:3-8 Hannah and her husband Elkanah go to Shiloh to worship the LORD.

I Sam 1:9-18 Hannah's prayer to the LORD. Eli the priest mistakes her grief as drunkenness. She explains and he prays for her.

I Sam 1:19-28 Samuel is born and Hannah presents him to the LORD.

I Sam 2:1-10 Hannah's song of thanksgiving.

I Sam 2:11-26 The wickedness of Eli's sons.

I Sam 2:27-36 The prophecy against Eli's family.

I Sam 3:1-10 The word of the LORD first revealed to Samuel.

I Sam 3:11-18 GOD tells Samuel the destruction of Eli's house.

I Sam 3:19-21 Samuel established to be a prophet.

I Sam 4:1-9 Israel is smitten by the Philistines.

I Sam 4:10-11 And the ark of GOD was taken

I Sam 4:12-18 The death of Eli.

I Sam 4:18... And he had judged Israel 40 years.

I Sam 5 The Ark of GOD is a curse to the Philistines.

I Sam 5:1-9 The Philistine god Dagon is destroyed by the Ark of GOD.

I Samuel cont.

I Sam 5:10-12 Many Philistines died in the presence of the Ark of GOD.

I Sam 6:1-9 The Philistines consult on how to return the Ark.

I Sam 6:10-18 They bring it to Bethshemesh.

I Sam 6:19-21 The men of Bethshemesh are smitten by the LORD for looking into the Ark. Over 5000 are killed.

I Sam 7:1-4 The Ark removed to Kiriath-jearim, where it rested for 20 years.

I Sam 7:5-6 The Israelites solemnly repent.

I Sam 7:7-14 The Philistines are beaten by the LORD.

I Sam 7:15 And Samuel judged Israel all the days of his life.

I Sam 7:16 And he went from year to year in circuit to Beth-el, and Gilgal, and Mizpeh, and judged Israel in all those places.

I Sam 8:1 Samuel was old and made his sons judges over Israel.

I Sam 8:2-9 His sons were corrupt judges and the people ask for a king.

I Sam 9:1-10 Saul, of Benjamin, is brought to Samuel.

I Sam 9:11-17 The LORD tells Samuel of Saul to become king.

I Sam 10:1-8 Samuel anoints Saul.

I Sam 10:9-16 Saul prophesies.

I Sam 10:17-27 Saul chosen king.

I Samuel cont. 2

I Sam 11:1-11 Saul rescues the men of Jabesh-Gilead from the Ammonites.

I Sam 11:6 And the SPIRIT of GOD came upon Saul when he heard those tidings, and his anger was kindled greatly.

I Sam 11:7-8 330,000 men of Israel and Judah rally to help Saul against the Ammonites.

I Sam 11:15 All the people go to Gilgal to confirm Saul as king, after the victory over Ammon.

I Sam 12 Samuel testifies to and reproves the people over their actions.

I Sam 12:16-18 Samuel demonstrates the power of prayer as compared to the mere actions of a king.

I Sam 12:16 Samuel predicts Rain and Thunder on a clear day, during a time of year when they do not occur.

I Sam 12:18 So Samuel called unto the LORD; and the LORD sent thunder and rain that day; and all the people greatly feared the LORD and Samuel.

I Sam 13 Saul sacrifices to the LORD and falls from Grave. He loses his future kingdom to another.

I Sam 13:13 And Samuel said to Saul, Thou hast done foolishly: thou hast not kept the commandment of the LORD thy GOD, which HE commanded thee: for now would the LORD have established thy kingdom upon Israel.

I Samuel cont. 3

I Sam 13:14 But now thy kingdom shall not continue: the LORD hath sought him a man after his own heart, and the LORD hath commanded him to be captain over his people because thou hast not kept that which the LORD commanded thee.

I Sam 14 Jonathan, the son of Saul, finds a secret path around Michmash to attack the Philistines.

I Sam 14:6 And Jonathan said to the young man that bore his armour, Come and let us go over unto the garrison of these uncircumcised: it may be that the LORD will work for us: for there is no restraint to the LORD to save by many or by few.

I Sam 14:7-23 The Philistines are defeated.

I Sam 15 Saul destroys the Amalekites, but does not follow the commandment of the LORD.

I Sam 15:22 And Samuel said, Hath the LORD as great delight in burnt offerings and sacrifices as in obeying the voice of the LORD? Behold, to obey is better than sacrifice, and to hearken than the fat of rams.

I Sam 15:35 Samuel no longer sees Saul, except at his death, Samuel mourns for Saul:

and the LORD repented that HE had made Saul king over Israel.

I Samuel cont. 4

I Sam 16:1-13 Samuel sent to Bethlehem unto Jesse to anoint David as king.

I Sam 16:7 But the LORD said unto Samuel, Look not on his countenance, or on the height of his stature; because I have refused him: for the LORD seeth not as man seeth; for man looketh on the outward appearance, but the LORD looketh on the heart.

I Sam 16:13 Then Samuel took the horn of oil and anointed him in the midst of his brethren: and the SPIRIT of the LORD came upon David from that day forward. So Samuel rose up and went to Ramath.

I Sam 17:1-11 Goliath, the giant Philistine, challenges Saul's army.

I Sam 17:12-36 David the son of Jesse, goes to Saul's camp and tells of his slaying of a lion and a bear to protect his sheep.

I Sam 17:36 Thy servant slew both the lion and the bear: and this uncircumcised Philistine shall be as one of them, seeing he hath despised the armies of the Living GOD.

I Sam 17:50 So David prevailed over the Philistine with a sling and a stone, and smote the Philistine and slew him...

I Sam 18:1-5 Jonathan and David become friends.

I Sam 18:6-11 Saul seeks to kill David.

I Sam 18:7... Saul hath slain his thousands and David his ten thousands.

I Samuel cont. 6

I Sam 24:1-7 David saves Saul's life in the cave near Engedi.

I Sam 24:4 ... Then David arose, and cut off the skirt of Saul's robe privily.

I Sam 24:6 And he said unto his men, The LORD forbid that I should do this thing, unto my master the LORD's anointed, to stretch forth my hand against him, seeing he is the anointed of the LORD.

I Sam 24:8-15 David declares his innocence to Saul.

I Sam 24:16-22 Saul agrees to David's innocence.

I Sam 25:1 And Samuel died: and all of Israel gathered together and lamented him and buried him at his house in Ramath. And David arose and went to the wilderness in Paran.

I Sam 25:2-44 The story of Nabal who was rauc and ungrateful to David's men. Abigail, Nabal's wife, convinces David not to destroy Nabal. When Nabal dies at the LORD's hand, Abigail becomes David's wife.

I Sam 26 Saul again goes after David, who saves Saul's life the second time.

I Sam 26:9 And David said to Abishai, Destroy him not: for who can stretch forth his hand against the LORD's anointed, and be guiltless?

I Sam 27 David moves to Gath among the Philistines. Achish, King of Gath, gives David Ziklag.

I Sam 28 Saul consults a witch to bring a vision of Samuel.

I Samuel cont. 5

I Sam 18:8-11 Saul's anger caused him to attempt to kill David with a Javelin.

I Sam 18:29 ... and Saul became David's enemy continually.

I Sam 19 Saul attempts again to kill David with a Javelin.

I Sam 19:11-12 Michal, David's wife, saves him.

I Sam 19:18-24 David flees to Samuel.

I Sam 19:20-24 the SPIRIT of GOD is upon the messengers of Saul, and Saul himself, as they prophesy before Samuel.

I Sam 20 Jonathan and David form a plan to determine if Saul truly plans to kill David.

I Sam 20:37-40 Jonathan shoots arrows to warn David of Saul's plan to kill him.

I Sam 21 David flees to Achimelech the priest.

I Sam 21:6 So the priest gave him hallowed bread: for there was no bread there but the showbread, that was taken from before the LORD, to put hot bread in the day when it was taken away.

I Sam 21:8-9 David takes the sword of Goliath which had been stored there.

I Sam 21: David flees to Achish, the king of Gath, and pretends to be mad.

I Sam 22 Saul orders Doeg the Edomite to kill the priests who helped David.

I Sam 23 Saul chases David through several cities in Judah.

I Samuel cont. 7

I Sam 28:15-18 Samuel appears as a spirit, and reminds Saul of his disobedience to the LORD. The kingdom has been given to David, and Saul and his sons are to perish at the hands of the Philistines.

I Sam 29 David is not allowed to be part of the Philistine army.

I Sam 30 David's town of Ziklag is attacked by the Amalekites. David asks the LORD's help and overcomes and destroys the Amalekites and recovers all that was taken, including his two wives.

I Sam 30:8 And David enquired at the LORD, saying, Shall I pursue after this troop? shall I overtake them? And HE answered him, Pursue: for thou shalt surely overtake them, and without fail recover all.

I Sam 31 Saul and his three sons, including Jonathan, die in a battle with the Philistines. Saul falls on his own sword after being wounded.

I Sam 31:11-13 The men of Jabesh-Gilead rescued the bodies of Saul and his sons.
