

## II Kings

II Kings 1:3 But the angel of the LORD said to Elijah the Tishbite, Arise, go up to meet the messengers of the king of Samaria, and say unto them, Is it not because there is not a God in Israel, that ye go to enquire of Baalzebub the god of Ekron?

II Kings 1:8 And he said unto them, What manner of man was he? come up to meet you, and told you these words?

II Kings 1:8 And they answered him, He was an hairy man, and girt with a girdle of leather about his loins. And he said, It is Elijah the Tishbite.

II Kings 1:9-10 Elijah calls fire from heaven to consume the soldiers of King Ahaziah.

II Kings 1:12 And Elijah answered and said unto them, If I be a man of God, let fire come down from heaven, and consume thee and thy fifty. And the fire of God came down from heaven, and consumed him and his fifty.

II Kings 1:17 So he died according to the word of the LORD which Elijah had spoken...

II Kings 2 Elijah ascends to heaven in a whirlwind

II Kings 2:1 And it came to pass, when the LORD would take up Elijah into heaven by a whirlwind, that Elijah went with Elisha from Gilgal.

## II Kings cont.

II Kings 2:7-8 Elijah divide the Jordan river.

II Kings 2:8 And Elijah took his mantle, and wrapped it together, and smote the waters, and they were divided hither and thither, so that they two went over on dry ground.

II Kings 2:9 And it came to pass, when they were gone over, that Elijah said unto Elisha, Ask what I shall do for thee, before I be taken away from thee. And Elisha said, I pray thee, let a double portion of thy spirit be upon me.

II Kings 2:10 And he said, Thou hast asked a hard thing: nevertheless, if thou see me, when I am taken from thee, it shall be so unto thee; but if not, it shall not be so.

II Kings 2:11 And it came to pass, as they still went on, and talked, that behold, there appeared a chariot of fire, and horses of fire, and parted them both asunder; and Elijah went up by a whirlwind into heaven.

II Kings 2:12-15 Elisha parts the Jordan river.

II Kings 3 For the sake of Jehoshaphat, King of Judah, Elisha brings water to defeat Moab.

II Kings 4:1-7 Elisha multiplies the widow's oil that she might sell it, to save her sons from prison.

II Kings 4:8-17 A faithful Shunammite woman cares for Elisha, and he foretells the birth of her son.

## II Kings cont. 2

II Kings 4:18-37 Elisha restores the life of the Shunammite son.

II Kings 4:33 He went in therefore, and shut the door upon them twain, and prayed unto the LORD.

II Kings 4:34 And he went up, and lay upon the child, and put his mouth upon his mouth, and his eyes upon his eyes, and his hands upon his hands: and he stretched himself upon the child; and the flesh of the child waxed warm.

II Kings 4:35 Then he returned, and walked in the house to and fro; and went up, and stretched himself upon him; and the child sneezed seven times, and the child opened his eyes.

II Kings 4:37 Then she went in, and fell at his feet, and bowed herself to the ground, and took up her son, and went out.

II Kings 4:38-44 The miracles of healing the pottage, and feeding the sons of the prophets.

II Kings 5 Elisha leads Naaman of his leprosy.

## II Kings cont. 3

II Kings 6:1-7 Elisha causes the axe head to swim.

II Kings 6:8-12 Elisha reveals the location of the Syrian army.

II Kings 6:13-23 Elisha leads the blind of Syria to the midst of Israel at Samaria.

II Kings 6:24-33 The Syrian siege of Samaria.

II Kings 7 Elisha promises food unto the King at Samaria, and the Syrian host flees.

II Kings 7:1 Then Elisha said, Hear ye the word of the LORD: Thus saith the LORD: Tomorrow about this time shall a measure of fine flour be sold for a shekel, and two measures of barley for a shekel, in the gate of Samaria.

II Kings 7:6 For the LORD had made the host of the Syrians to have a noise of chariots, and a noise of horses, even the noise of a great host: and they said one to another, Lo, the King of Israel hath hired against us the King of the Hittites, and the King of the Egyptians, to come upon us.

II Kings 7:7 Wherefore they arose and fled in the twilight, and left their tents, and their horses, and their asses, even the camp as it was, and fled for their life.

II Kings 7:16 And the people went out, and spoiled the tents of the Syrians: so a measure of fine flour was sold for a shekel, and two measures of barley for a shekel, according to the word of the LORD.
