

II Kings cont. 4

2 Kings 8:1-2 Elisha predicts a Tyrian famine.

2 Kings 8:7-15 Elisha visits Damascus, Syria and predicts the reign of Hazael and Syria.

→ 2 Kings 9: Jehu becomes king. Jezebel killed.

2 Kings 9:33 And he said, throw her down; so they threw her down: and some of her blood was upon the wall, and on the steps: and he trod her under foot.

☒ 2 Kings 9:35 And they went to bury her: but they found no more of her than the skull, and the feet and the palms of her hands.

2 Kings 9:36 Whence they came again and told him. And he said, This is the work of the LORD, which he spake by his servant Elijah the Tishbite, saying, In the portion of Jezreel shall dogs eat the flesh of Jezebel:

2 Kings 9:37 And the carcase of Jezebel shall be as dung upon upon the face of the field in the portion of Jezreel; so that they shall not say this is Jezebel.

2 Kings 10: Jehu has the power of Ahab and all his house destroyed.

2 Kings 10:19-29 Jehu ends Baal worship in Israel

☒ 2 Kings 11 Joash is hidden from Queen Athaliah by Jehoiada the priest.

II Kings cont. 6

2 Kings 18:13-37 The King of Assyria, Sennacherib, sends his army to besiege Judah and Jerusalem.

☒ 2 Kings 19 Hezekiah calls upon the LORD through Isaiah the prophet.

2 Kings 19:6 And Isaiah said unto them Thus shall ye say unto your master, They say unto the LORD Be not afraid of the words which thou hast heard, with which the servants of the king of Assyria have blasphemed me.

2 Kings 19:7 Behold, I will send a blast upon him, and he shall hear a rumour and shall return to his own land; and I will cause him to fall by the sword in his own land.

2 Kings 19:32 Therefore thus saith the LORD concerning the king of Assyria, He shall not come into this city, nor shoot thy arrow there, nor come before it with shield: not cast a bank against it.

2 Kings 19:34 For I will defend this city, to save it for mine own sake, and for my servant David's sake.

2 Kings 19:35 And it came to pass that night, that the angel of the LORD went out, and smote in the camp of the Assyrians an hundred and fourscore and five thousand: and when they arose early in the morning, behold, they were all dead corpses!

II Kings cont. 5

2 Kings 11:4-16 Joash becomes king over Judah, and Athaliah is executed.

☒ 2 Kings 11:17 And Jehoiada made a covenant between the LORD and the king and the people, that they should be the LORD's people.

2 Kings 12 Jehoash (Joash) reigns 40 years.

2 Kings 12:2 And Jehoash did that which was right in the sight of the LORD all the days of his life wherein Jehoiada the priest instructed him.

2 Kings 12:4-16 Jehoash repairs the temple to be repaired.

☒ 2 Kings 12:9 But Jehoiada the priest took a shield, and bored a hole in the head of it, and set it beside the altar, on the right side as one cometh into the house of the LORD: and the priests that kept the door put therein all the money that was brought into the house of the LORD.

☒ 2 Kings 13:20 And Elisha died and they buried him...

2 Kings 14 War between Judah and Israel.

☒ 2 Kings 17 The King of Assyria conquers Israel and carries away the people. He then repopulates Samaria with people from other lands.

☒ 2 Kings 18:1-8 Good reign of Hezekiah in Judah

II Kings cont. 7

2 Kings 20 Hezekiah is sick unto death and prays to the LORD for help. Isaiah tells him the LORD won't die.

☒ 2 Kings 20:5 Turn again, and tell Hezekiah the captain of my people Thus saith the LORD, the God of David thy father, I have heard thy prayer, I have seen thy tears: behold I will heal thee on the third day thou shalt go up into the house of the LORD.

2 Kings 20:6 And I will add unto thy days fifteen years; and I will deliver thee and this city out of the hand of the king of Assyria; and I will defend this city for mine own sake, and for my servant David's sake.

☒ 2 Kings 20:8-11 Isaiah tells Hezekiah of a sign: the sun dial goes backwards.

☒ 2 Kings 20:11 And Isaiah the prophet cried unto the LORD: and he brought the shadow ten degrees backward, by which it had gone down in the dial of Ahaz.

2 Kings 20:12-21 Hezekiah gives all his treasure to men from Babylon. Isaiah tells him the LORD's work.

☒ 2 Kings 20:17 Behold, he days come, that all that is in thy house and that which thy fathers have laid up in store unto this day, shall be carried into Babylon: nothing shall be left with the LORD.

II Kings cont. 8

2 Kings 21 Manasseh's evil reign over Judah.

2 Kings 22 Josiah a faithful ruler in Judah.
The Law of Moses is found in the Temple.

2 K: 22:11 And it came to pass, when the king had heard the words of the book of the law, that he went into the temple.

2 Kings 23:1-3 Josiah reads the law unto the people and renewed the covenant.

2 K: 23:4-14 Josiah destroys idolatry.

2 K: 23:7 And he brake down the houses of the sorcerers, that were by the house of the LORD, where the women wove hangings for the grove.

2 K: 23:21 And the king commanded all the people, saying, Keep the sabbath unto the LORD your GOD, as it is written in the book of this covenant.

2 K: 24 Nebuchadnezzar, king of Babylon attacks Jerusalem. All the treasures of the Temple and the king and his people are carried as captives into Babylon, as predicted by the LORD's prophet.

2 K: 25 Siege of Jerusalem and deportation to Babylon.
