

II Kings 1: Elijah calls Fire from Heaven

II Kings 1:3-8 King Ahaziah is injured and Elijah condemns him for seeking Beelzebub of Ekron.

II Kings 1:8 And they answered him, He was an hairy man, and girt with a girdle of leather about his loins. And he said, it is Elijah, the Tishbite, (John the Baptist)

II Kings 1:12 Elijah calls fire from heaven to consume 50 soldiers and their leader, twice.

II Kings 1:17 King Ahaziah dies as Elijah predicted.

II Kings 2: Elijah ascends to heaven in a whirlwind.

II Kings 2:7-8 Elijah divides the Jordan River

II Kings 2:9-10 Elisha asks for a double portion of Elijah's spirit

II Kings 2:11 And it came to pass, as they still went on and talked that, behold, there appeared a chariot of fire and horses of fire, and parted them both asunder; and Elijah went up by a whirlwind into heaven.

II Kings 2:12-15 Elisha parts the Jordan River.

II Kings 2:19-22 Elisha's Second Miracle: he heals the waters.

II Kings 3 For the sake of Jehoshaphat, king of Judah, Elisha brings water and Moab is defeated

II Kings 4:1-7 Elisha multiplies the widow's oil that she might sell it, to save her sons from prison.

II Kings 4:8-17 A faithful Shunamite woman cares for Elisha, and he foretells the birth of her son.

II Kings 4:18-37 Elisha restores the life of the Shunamite's son.

II Kings 4:38-44 The miracles of healing the potage, and feeding the sons of the prophets

II Kings 5 Elisha heals Naaman of Leprosy.

II Kings 5:20-27 Gehazi's sin and penalty; he becomes a leper.

II Kings 6:1-7 Elisha causes the lost axe head to swim.

II Kings 6:8-12 Elisha reveals the location of the Syrian army.

II Kings 6:13-23 Elisha leads the blinded Syrians to the midst of Israel at Samaria.

II Kings 6:24-33 The Syrian Siege of Samaria.

II Kings 7 Elisha promises food unto the King at Samaria, and the Syrians hast flee.

II Kings 7:6 For the LORD had made the host of the Syrians to hear a noise of chariots, and a noise of horses, even the noise of a great host: and they said one to another, Lo, the king of Israel hath hired against us the kings of the Hittites and the kings of the Egyptians against us...

II Kings cont. 2

II Kings 7:7 Wherefore they arose and fled in the twilight, and left their tents and their horses, and their asses, even the camp as it was, and fled for their life.

II Kings 7:16-20 Elisha's promise fulfilled: the people of Samaria spoil the Syrians.

II Kings 8:1-2 Elisha predicts a 7 year famine

II Kings 8:7-15 Elisha visits Damascus, Syria and predicts the reign of Hazael over Syria.

II Kings 9 Jehu becomes king. Jezebel killed.

II Kings 9:33 And he said, Throw her down. So they threw her down: and some of her blood was sprinkled on the wall, and on the horses: and he trode her under foot.

II Kings 9:35 And they went to bury her: but they found no more of her than the skull, and the feet, and the palms of her hands.

II Kings 9:36... This is the word of the LORD, which HE spake by HIS servant Elijah the Tishbite, saying, In the portion of Jezebel shall dogs eat the flesh of Jezebel.

II Kings 10 Jehu has the princes of Ahab and all his house destroyed.

II Kings 10:19-29 Jehu ends Beal worship in Israel

II Kings 11 Joash is hidden from Queen Athaliah by Jehoiada the priest.

II Kings 11:4-16 Joash becomes king over Judah, and Athaliah is executed.

II Kings 11:17-21 The worship of the LORD is restored

II Kings 12 Jehoshaphat (Joash) reigns 40 years

II Kings cont. 3

II Kings 12:2 And Jehoshaphat did that which was right in the sight of the LORD all the days of his life wherein Jehoiada the priest instructed him.

II Kings 4-16 Jehoshaphat requires the temple to be repaired.

II Kings 12:9 But Jehoiada the priest took a chest, and bored a hole in the lid of it, and set it beside the altar, on the right side as one cometh into the house of the LORD: and the priests that kept the door put therein all the money that was brought into the House of the LORD. First Offering Box

II Kings 13:20 And Elishah died and they buried him...

II Kings 14 War between Judah and Israel

II Kings 15 King Azariah (Uzziah), son of Amaziah reigns 52 years in Judah: and he did that which was right in the sight of the LORD. Several kings of Israel, reigning at Samaria.

II Kings 16 The wicked reign of Ahaz over Judah.

II Kings 16:5-6 Invasion of Judah by Syria & Israel.

II Kings 16:7-8 Ahaz gets assistance from Assyria

II Kings 16:10-20 Ahaz gets an idol from Damascus and spoils the temple.

II Kings 17 The king of Assyria conquers Israel and carries away the people. He then repopulates Samaria with people from other lands.

II Kings 17:7-17 The Sins of Israel described.

II Kings 17:23 Until the LORD removed Israel out of HIS sight... So was Israel carried away to Assyria unto the end

II Kings cont. 4

II Kings 17:24 And the King of Assyria brought men from Babylon, and from Cuthah, and from Ara, and from Hamath, and from Sepharvaim, and placed them in the cities of Samaria, instead of the children of Israel: and they possessed Samaria, and dwelt in the cities thereof.

II Kings 17:25-26 The LORD sends Lions among the imported people of Samaria, and kills some of them.

II Kings 17:27-41 The imported people refuse to worship the LORD unto this day.

II Kings 18:1-8 Good reign of Hezekiah in Judah.

II Kings 18:4 Hezekiah removed the high places, groves, and idols of worship.

II Kings 18:5 He trusted in the LORD GOD of Israel, so that after him there was none like him among all the kings of Judah, nor any that were before him.

II Kings 18:6 For he clave to the LORD, and departed not from following HIM, but kept HIS commandments, which the LORD commanded Moses.

II Kings 18:7 And the LORD was with him, and he prospered whithersoever he went forth: and he rebelled against the king of Assyria and served him not.

II Kings 18:13-37 The king of Assyria, Sennacherib, sends his army to besiege Judah, and Jerusalem.

II Kings 18:17-37 Sennacherib's servant, Rabshethak, mocks the LORD and his people.

II Kings cont. 5

II Kings 19 Hezekiah calls upon the LORD through Isaiah the prophet.

II Kings 19:6... Thus saith the LORD, be not afraid of the words which thou hast heard, with which, the servants of the King of Assyria have blasphemed ME.

II Kings 19:7 Behold, I will send a blast upon him, and he shall hear a rumor and shall return to his own land; and I will cause him to fall by the sword in his own land.

II Kings 19:32 The LORD promises to defend Jerusalem from Assyria.

II Kings 19:34 For I will defend this city, to save it for mine own sake, and for my servant David's sake.

II Kings 19:35 And it came to pass that night, that the Angel of the LORD went out and smote in the camp of the Assyrians, and hundred and fourscore and five thousand: and when they arose early in the morning, they were all dead corpses! 195,000 killed

II Kings 19:36-37 Sennacherib, king of Assyria returns to Nineveh, the capital, and is killed by his own sons.

II Kings 20 Hezekiah is sick unto death and prays to the LORD for help.

II Kings 20:4-6 The LORD answers his prayer through Isaiah and adds Fifteen Years to his life.

II Kings 20:8-11 Isaiah tells Hezekiah of a sign: the sun dial goes backwards.

II Kings cont. 6

II Kings 20:21 Hezekiah shows all his treasures to men from Babylon. Isaiah tells him the LORD's words:

II Kings 20:17 Behold, the days come that all that is in thy house, and that which thy fathers have laid up in store unto this day, shall be carried into Babylon: nothing shall be left saith the LORD.

II Kings 20:20 Hezekiah's accomplishments included bringing water into the city by conduit.

II Kings 20:21 Death of Hezekiah.

II Kings 21 Manasseh's evil reign over Judah.

II Kings 22 Josiah, a faithful ruler in Judah. The Law of Moses is found in the Temple.

II Kings 22:11 And it came to pass, when the king had heard the words of the book of the Law, that he rent his clothes.

II Kings 23:1-3 Josiah reads the law unto the people and renews the covenant.

II Kings 23:4-14 Josiah destroys idolatry.

II Kings 23:7 And he brake down the houses of the sodomites...

II Kings 23:21 And the king commanded all the people, saying, Keep the Passover unto the LORD your GOD, as it is written in the book of this covenant.

II Kings 24 Nebuchadnezzar, king of Babylon seizes Jerusalem, as predicted by the LORD's promise.

II Kings 25 Deportation to Babylon.
