I Kings cont.

I Kings 1 David makes Solomon King.

I Kings 2:1-3 David urges Solomon to keep the Laws and Ways of GOD.

I Kings 2:3 And keep the charge of the LORD, to walk in HIS ways, to keep HIS statutes, and HIS commandments and HIS judgements, and HIS testimonies, as it is written in the Law of Moses, that thou mayest prosper in all that thou doest, and whithersoever thou turnest thyself.

I Kings 2:4 David reminds Solomon of the LORD's covenant with David and his family.

I Kings 2:5-46 The enemies of David and Solomon are killed.

I Kings 3:5 In Gibeon, the LORD appeared to Solomon in a dream by night: and GOD said, Ask what I shall give thee.

I Kings 3:6 And Solomon said unto GOD, Thou hast showed great mercy unto David my father, and hast made me to reign in his stead.

I Kings 3:7... and I am but a little child: I know not how to go out or come in.

I Kings 3:8 - II Chron 1:9 For Thou hast made me king over a people like the dust in multitude.

I Kings 3:9 Give therefore thy servant an understanding heart to judge thy people, that I may discern between good and bad: for who is able to judge this thy so great a people?

I Kings 3:10 And the speech pleased the LORD, that Solomon had asked this thing.

I Kings 3:11 And the LORD rewards Solomon for asking to have the ability to fairly judge the people, and not merely things for himself.

I Kings 3:12 Behold, I have done according to thy words: lo, I have given thee a wise and an understanding heart; so that there was none like thee, neither after thee shall any arise like unto thee, Wisdom.

I Kings 3:13-14 And the LORD also gave him things for which he did not ask: both riches and honor.

I Kings 3:16-28 The Wisdom of Solomon is proven. Solomon judges wisely between the two women who claim a child.

I Kings 3:28 And all Israel heard of the judgment which the king had judged, and they feared the king: for they saw that the Wisdom of GOD was in him, to do judgement.

I Kings 4 The splendor of Solomon

I Kings 5 Hiram, King of Tyre, helps Solomon to obtain materials for building the Temple.

I Kings 6:1 480 years after the children of Israel left Egypt, Solomon begins the Temple.

I Kings 6:38 The Temple is completed after 7 years.

I Kings 7 King Hiram of Tyre provides many fine works of gold, silver, and wood for the temple of the LORD.

I Kings 8:1-11 The dedication of the Temple

I Kings 8:6-9 The Ark of the Covenant of the LORD is brought to its place, the Oracle of the Temple, the HOLY of HOLIES.

I Kings 8:10-11 The GLORY of the LORD is in the form of a cloud, fills the Temple!

I Kings 8:22-53 Solomon's prayer.

I Kings 8:23 And he said, LORD GOD of Israel, there is no GOD like thee, in heaven above, or on earth beneath, who keepest covenant and mercy with thy servants that walk before thee with all their heart.

I Kings 9 The LORD's covenant with Solomon.

I Kings 9:1-2 ... that the LORD appeared to Solomon the second time, as HE had appeared to him at Gibeon.

I Kings 10 Solomon and the Queen of Sheba

I Kings 11 Solomon is turned away from JEHOVAH by his many wives and worships idols.

I Kings 12 Ten tribes revolt from Rehoboam, the son of Solomon. Judah and Benjamin remain.

I Kings 12:25-33 Jeroboam reigns over the 10 tribes of Israel and causes them to worship idols.

I Kings 13 Jeroboam's hand is withered. A prophet of the LORD is deceived and is killed by a lion.

I Kings 14 Death of Jeroboam and Rehoboam

I Kings cont. 3

I Kings 15 Asa reigned 41 years in Judah.

I Kings 15:5 Because David did that which was right in the eyes of the LORD, and turned not aside from any thing that HE commanded him all the days of his life, save only in the matter of Uriah the Hittite.

I Kings 15:11 And Asa did that which was right in the eyes of the LORD, as did David his father.

I Kings 16 Several Kings of Israel; and Samaria is built.

I Kings 16:30 And Ahab, the son of Omri: did evil in the sight of the LORD above all that were before him.

I Kings 17 The ministry of Elijah begins. His prediction of three years drought. Elijah raises the widow's son from the dead.

I Kings 17:2-7 GOD feeds Elijah at Cherith.

I Kings 17:6 And the ravens brought him bread and flesh in the morning, and bread and flesh in the evening; and he drank of the brook.

I Kings 17:8-16 GOD feeds Elijah at Zarephath.

17:9 Get thee to Zarephath, a widow woman shall sustain thee.

17:10-13 She has only a small amount of meal and oil. Elijah promises:

17:14 For thus saith the LORD GOD of Israel, The barrel of meal shall not waste, neither shall the cruse of oil fail, until the day that the LORD sendeth rain.

First Miracle

(see 2 Chron 1)

I Kings 17:17-24 Elijah raises a widow's son

17:17 The widow's son galls sick, and his sickness was so sore, that there was no breath left in him.

17:20-21 And he cried unto the LORD: And he stretched himself upon the child three times, and cried unto the LORD and said, O LORD my GOD I pray thee, let this child's soul come into him again.

17:22 And the LORD heard the voice of Elijah; and the soul of the child came into him again, and he revived.

I Kings 18 Elijah asks the LORD for rain and slays the prophets of Baal.

I Kings 18:30-36 Elijah builds an altar unto the LORD and soaks the offering, altar, and all in water.

I Kings 18:37 Hear me, O LORD, hear me that this people may know that THOU art the LORD GOD, and that THOU hast turned their heart back again.

I Kings 18:38 Then the fire of the LORD fell, and consumed the barat sacrifice, and the wood, and the stones, and the dust, and licked up the water that was in the trench.

I Kings 19:1-3 Jezebel the queen threatens Elijah. He flees to the wilderness.

I Kings 19:5-7 An Angel of the LORD appears to Elijah twice and provides food & water.

I Kings 21:17-29 Elijah announces Ahab's doom.

I Kings 21:23 And of Jezebel also spoke the LORD, saying, The dogs shall eat Jezebel by the wall of Jezreel.

I Kings 22:15-28 Micaiah predicts the death of Ahab.

I Kings 22:29-40 Death of Ahab in battle with the Syrians.

I Kings 22:41-50 Jehoshaphat's good reign over Judah.

I Kings 19:8 After eating, Elijah goes forty days and forty nights unto Horeb the mount of GOD.

I Kings 19:9 Elijah lodges in a cave and the Word of the LORD came unto him, What doest thou here Elijah?

I Kings 19:10-12 Wind earthquakes, fire, and a still small voice are heard by Elijah.

I Kings 19:15-16 The LORD tells Elijah to anoint Hazael to be king of Syria, Jehu to be king of Israel, and Elisha to be his assistant and replacement.

I Kings 19:19-21 The Call of Elisha.

I Kings 20 Benhadad, the king of Syria, besieges Samaria, the city of Ahab.

I Kings 20:15 Ahab, king of Israel, numbered the young men of the princes as 232 and the children of Israel as 7,000.

I Kings 20:16-21 The LORD helps the small army of Israel to defeat the Syrians.

I Kings 20:22 The prophet warns Ahab of a Second Attack by the Syrians.

I Kings 20:22-30 Israel again defeats Syria and 100,000 footmen of Syria are killed in Ides.

I Kings 20:31-43 Ahab makes peace with Syria.

I Kings 21:1-4 Ahab covets Naboth's Vineyard.

I Kings 21:5-16 Naboth is murdered by Jezebel.
