

[II Chronicles]

II Chron 1 Solomon asks for wisdom.

II Chron 1:7 In that night did God appear unto Solomon, and said unto him, ASK what I shall give thee.

II Chron 1:8 And Solomon said unto God That thou hast shewed great mercy unto David my father, and hast made me to reign on his stool.

II Chron 1:9 Now O LORD GOD let thy promise unto David my father be established: for thou hast made me king over a people like the last of the earth in multitude.

II Chron 1:10 Give me now wisdom and knowledge, that I may go out and come in before this people: for who can judge this thy people, that is so great?

II Chron 1:12 Wisdom and knowledge is granted unto thee...

II Chron 2 Solomon prepares to build the temple.

II Chron 3:4 The temple is built.

II Chron 5 The temple is completed.

II Chron 5:13-14 The GLORY of the LORD fills the Temple

II Chron 6:12-42 Solomon's prayer of dedication.

II Chron 7:12 And the LORD appeared to Solomon by night, and said unto him, I have heard thy prayer, and have chosen this place to MYSELF for an house of sacrifice.

II Chron 8 Solomon keeps the LORD's commandments.

II Chron 9 The Queen of Sheba visits Solomon

II Chron 9:13 Now the weight of gold that came to Solomon in one year was six hundred threescore and six talents of gold.

[II Chronicles] cont. 2

II Chron 14 The LORD fights for Asa and Judah.

II Chron 14: 8 Asa had an army of 300,000 from Judah and 280,000 from Benjamin 580,000 men

II Chron 14: 9 And there came out against them Zerah the Ethiopian with a host of a thousand thousand and three hundred chariots; and came unto Mareschah. 1 million men

II Chron 14:11 And Asa cried unto the LORD his GOD, and said, LORD, it is nothing with thee to help, whether with many, or with them that have no power: help us, O LORD our GOD; for we rest on thee, and in thy name we go against this multitude. O LORD, thou art our GOD; let not man prevail against thee.

Asa's Prayer

II Chron 14:12 So the LORD smote the Ethiopians before Asa, and before Judah; and the Ethiopians fled

II Chron 16 Asa sought the LORD and rebuked the king of Syria to fight against Baasha king of Israel

II Chron 16:7-9 Hanani the seer rebuked Asa for relying on Syria instead of the LORD.

II Chron 18 Were not the Ethiopians and the Lubims a huge host, with very many chariots and horsemen? yet because thou didst rely on the LORD, HE delivered them into thy hand.

[II Chronicles] cont.

II Chron 9:14-28 The splendor of Solomon

II Chron 9:29-31 The death of Solomon.

II Chron 10 Rehoboam refuses to listen to the wise elders and loses the kingdom to Jeroboam. Only Judah & Benjamin remained with him.

II Chron 10:19 And Israel rebelled against the house of David unto this day.

II Chron 11 Rehoboam fled by Shemariah not to tell Israel

II Chron 12 Rehoboam forsook the LORD and is conquered by the king of Egypt.

II Chron 13 Abijah becomes king of Judah and calls upon the LORD. He defeats Jeroboam of Israel.

II Chron 14 Asa becomes king of Judah.

II Chron 14: 2 And Asa did that which was good and right in the eyes of the LORD his GOD:

II Chron 14:3 For he took away the altars of the strange gods, and the high places, and broke down the images, and cut down the grove:

II Chron 14:4 And he commanded Judah to seek the LORD GOD of their fathers, and to do the law and the commandment.

II Chron 15 Oded the prophet brings word from the LORD to Asa. Asa removes all the idols out of Judah and Benjamin.

II Chron 15:12 And they entered into a covenant to seek the LORD GOD of their fathers with all their heart and with all their soul.

[II Chronicles] cont. 3

II Chron 16:9 For the eyes of the LORD ran to and fro throughout the whole earth, to show himself strong in the behalf of them whose heart is perfect toward HIM. (Hence thou hast done foolishly: therefore shall come from beneath thou shalt have war.)

II Chron 17 Jehoshaphat becomes king and seeks the LORD as GOD of Israel

II Chron 17:6 And his heart was lifted up in the ways of the LORD: moreover he took away the high places and groves out of Judah.

II Chron 18 Jehoshaphat becomes an ally of Ahab king of Israel. Against the LORD's advice, they go to battle against Syria and are defeated.

II Chron 19 Jehoshaphat is rebuked by Jehu for his alliance with Ahab.

II Chron 20 Judah is invaded by Moab and Ammon, who cry to the LORD for help.

II Chron 20:22 And when they began to sing and to praise the LORD set ambushments against the children of Ammon, Moab, and mount Seir, which were come against Judah; and they were smitten.

II Chron 20:24 And when Judah came toward the watch towers in the wilderness, they looked unto the multitude, and, behold, they were dead bodies fallen to the earth, and none escaped.

II Chron 21 Jeconiah's evil neighbor Judah: he slew his brethren!
