II Chron 1 Solomon asks for wisdom.

II Chron 1:7 In that night did GOD appear to Solomon, and said unto him, Ask what I shall give thee.

II Chron 1:8-9 Solomon thanks the LORD for fulfilling HIS promise to David in making his son Solomon king over a great multitude.

II Chron 1:10 Give me now wisdom and knowledge, that I may go out and come in before this people: for who can judge this thy people, that is so great?

II Chron 1:12 Wisdom and Knowledge is granted unto thee...

II Chron 2 Solomon prepares to build the temple

II Chron 3 & 4 The temple is built.

II Chron 5 The temple is completed

II Chron 5:7-9 The Ark is brought into the temple

II Chron 5:10 There was nothing in the Ark save the two tables which Moses put therein at Horeb, when the LORD made a covenant with the children of Israel, when they came out of Egypt.

II Chron 5:13-14 The GLORY of the LORD fills the Temple

II Chron 6:12-42 Solomon's prayer of dedication.

II Chron 7:12 And the LORD appeared to Solomon by night, and said unto him, I have heard thy prayer, and have chosen this place to MYSELF for an house of sacrifice.

II Chron 8 Solomon keeps the LORD's commandments

II Chron 9 The Queen of Sheba visits Solomon.

II Chronicles cont. 2

II Chron 14:9 And there came out against them Zerah the Ethiopian with a host of a thousand thousand, and three hundred chariots; and came to Mareshah. 1 million men

II Chron 14:11 And Asa cried unto the LORD his GOD, and said, LORD it is nothing with THEE to help, whether with many, or with few: help us, O LORD our GOD; for we rest on THEE, and in THY NAME, we go against this multitude. O LORD, THOU art our GOD; let not man prevail against THEE.

II Chron 14:12 So the LORD smote the Ethiopians before Asa, and before Judah; and the Ethiopians fled.

II Chron 15 Oded the prophet brings word from the LORD to Asa. Asa removes all the idols out of Judah and Benjamin.

II Chron 15:7 Be ye strong therefore, and let not your heads be weak: for your work shall be rewarded.

II Chron 15:12 And they entered into a covenant to seek the LORD GOD of their fathers with all their heart and with all their soul.

II Chron 16 Asa forsakes the LORD and relies on the King of Syria to fight against Baasha king of Israel.

II Chron 16:7-9 Hanani the seer rebukes Asa for relying on Syria instead of the LORD.

Asa's Prayer

II Chronicles cont.

II Chron 9:13 Now the weight of gold that came to Solomon in one year was six hundred and threescore and six talents of gold.

II Chron 9:14-18 The splendor of Solomon.

II Chron 9:29-31 The death of Solomon.

II Chron 10 Rehoboam refuses to listen to the wise elders and loses the kingdom to Jeroboam. Only Judah and Benjamin remained with him.

II Chron 10:19 And Israel rebelled against the house of David unto this day.

II Chron 11 Rehoboam told by Shemaiah, the man of GOD, not to attack Israel. His army was 180,000.

II Chron 12 Rehoboam forsakes the LORD and is conquered by the king of Egypt.

II Chron 13 Abijah becomes king of Judah and calls upon the LORD. He defeats Jeroboam of Israel.

II Chron 13:3-19 Abijah has an army of 400,000 vs. Jeroboam's army of 800,000 men. The LORD helps Abijah and 500,000 men of Israel are killed.

II Chron 14 Asa becomes king of Judah

II Chron 14:2-4 Asa did that which was good and right in the eyes of the LORD his GOD:

He took away the altars, the high places, the groves, and brake the idols.

He commanded Judah to seek the LORD GOD of their fathers and to follow HIS commandments

II Chron 14:8-15 The LORD fights for Asa & Judah

II Chron 14:8 Asa had an army of 300,000 from Judah and 280,000 from Benjamin. 580,000 men.

II Chronicles cont. 3

II Chron 16:19 For the eyes of the LORD run to and fro throughout the whole earth, to show HIMSELF strong in the behalf of them whose heart is perfect toward HIM. (Herein thou hast done foolishly: therefore from hereafter thou shalt have wars.)

II Chron 17 Jehoshaphat becomes king and seeks the LORD as GOD of Israel.

II Chron 17:6 And his heart was listed up in the ways of the LORD: moreover he took away the high places and groves out of Judah!

II Chron 17:12-18 Jehoshaphat grew strong and had an army from Judah and Benjamin of 1,160,000.

II Chron 18 Jehoshaphat becomes an ally of Ahab king of Israel. Against the LORD's advice, they go to battle against Syria and are defeated.

II Chron 19 Jehoshaphat is rebuked by Jehu, the son of Hanani the seer, for supporting Ahab

II Chron 20 Judah is invaded by Moab and Jehoshaphat prays to the LORD for help.

II Chron 20:22 And when they began to sing and to praise, the LORD set ambushments against the children of Ammon, Moab, and mount Seir, which were come against Judah, and they were smitten.

II Chron 20:24 And when Judah came toward the watch tower in the wilderness, they looked unto the multitude, and, behold, they were dead bodies scattered to the earth, and none escaped.

II Chron 21 Jehoram's evil reign over Judah; he slays his brethren

## II Chronicles cont 4

II Chron 21:12-15 Elijah sends a message to Jehoram and predicts his death.

II Chron 22 The kings of Judah and Israel are destroyed and their heirs. The evil queen Athaliah reigns. Joash is saved.

II Chron 23 Joash becomes king over Judah and Athaliah is executed.

II Chron 24 Reign of Joash and death of Jehoiada the good priest.

II Chron 24:8-14 The Temple is repaired using the freewill offerings of the people.

II Chron 24:15 But Jehoiada waxed old, and was full of days when he died. An hundred and thirty years old was he when he died.

II Chron 24:20-22 Zechoriah, the son of Jehoida, warns Joash of wrongdoing, and is stoned to death by the men of Joash.

II Chron 24:23-24 A small army of Syria defeats a large army of Judah with the LORD's help.

II Chron 25 The reign of Amaziah over Judah.

II Chron 25:5-16 Amaziah defeats Edom with the LORD's help.

II Chron 25:17-25 Amaziah boasts to Joash king of Israel, who replies: "The thistle that was in Lebanon sent to the cedar that was in Lebanon...". Amaziah is defeated by Joash, who spoils Jerusalem.

II Chron 26 The reign of Uzziah over Judah and his intrusion into the priests office: he dies with leprosy.

## II Chronicles cont. 5

II Chron 27 The reign of Jotham over Judah.

II Chron 28 Evil reign of Ahaz over Judah. He lost a war with Peckah, King of Israel.

II Chron 29 Good reign of Hezekiah over Judah. He revives worship in the Temple.

II Chron 30 Hezekiah holds the Passover and invites all of Israel.

II Chron 30:8 Now be ye not stiffnecked, as your fathers were, but yield yourselves unto the LORD, and enter unto HIS sanctuary which HE hath sanctified for ever: and serve the LORD your GOD, that the fierceness of HIS wrath may turn away from you.

II Chron 31 Hezekiah restores the worship of the LORD.

II Chron 32 Hezekiah calls upon the LORD to defeat the attack from Sennacherib, King of Assyria.

II Chron 32:20 And for this cause Hezekiah the king, and the prophet Isaiah the son of Amoz, prayed and cried to heaven.

II Chron 33 Manasseh's evil reign over Judah. He is taken to Assyria and repents to the LORD.

II Chron 34 Josiah's righteous reign over Judah. He repairs the Temple. He reads the law to the people.

II Chron 34:31 And the King stood in his place and made a covenant before the LORD to walk after the LORD and to keep HIS commandments, and HIS testimonies, and HIS statutes, with all his heart, and with all his soul, to perform all the words of the covenant that was found in the House of the LORD.

II Chron 35 Josiah keeps the Passover the greatest since the days of Samuel. II Chron 36 Final Deportation: the captivity of Judah in Babylon.
