Amos 1 Warnings about the Judgment of surrounding peoples.

Amos 1:2 And he said, the LORD will roar from Zion, and utter HIS voice from Jerusalem;

Amos 2 Judgments upon Judah and Israel

Amos 3 The LORD has a unique relationship with the people of Israel and thus HE feels betrayed by them.

Amos 3:2 You only have I known of all the families of the earth: therefore I will punish you for all your iniquities.

Amos 4 The LORD warns Israel of HIS unheeded warnings.

Amos 4:13 For, lo, HE that formeth the mountains, and createth the wind, and declareth unto man what is HIS thought, that maketh the morning darkness, and treadeth upon the high places of the earth, the LORD, THE GOD of HOSTS, IS HIS name.

Amos 5:4-8 ... Seek the LORD and ye shall live...

Amos 5:4 For thus saith the LORD unto the house of Israel, Seek ye ME, and ye shall live:

Amos 6 The LORD warns those who have a false sense of security in their own innocence.

Amos 7:1-9 Amos has visions of judgments to come upon Israel

Amos 7:8 And the LORD said unto me Amos what seest thou? And I said A plumbline. Then said the LORD Behold I will set a plumbline in the midst of MY people Israel: I will not again pass by them any more:

Amos 7:10-17 Amos is threatened by Amaziah

Amos 7:12 Also Amaziah said unto Amos O thou seer, go, flee thee away unto the land of Judah, and there eat bread, and prophesy there:

Amos 7:13 But prophesy not again any more at Bethel: for it is the king's chapel, and it is the king's court.

Amos 8 The vision of 'Summer Fruit' Basket, Israel soon to perish.

Amos 8:2 And HE said Amos, what seest thou? And I said, A basket of summer fruit. Then said the LORD unto me The end has come upon my people Israel; I will not again pass by them any more.

Amos 8:11-14 A famine of the WORD of GOD.

Amos 9 The vision of the LORD standing upon the idolatrous altar at Bethel.

Amos 9:1-10 Wherever sinners flee from the LORD's justice, it will still overcome them.

Amos 9:11-15 The restoration of the Jews and the gospel blessing.
