Hab 1:1-4 Prayer of Habakkuk. ^{He prophesied in Suteh}

Hab 1:2 O LORD, how long shall I cry, and thou wilt not hear! even cry out unto THEE of violence, and THOU wilt not save!

Hab 1:5-11 JEHOVAH'S Answer

Hab 1:5 Behold ye among the heathen, and regard, and wonder marvellously: for I will work & work in your days, which ye will not believe, though it be told you.

Hab 1:6 For, lo, I raise up the Chaldeans, that bitter and hasty nation, which shall march through the breadth of the land, to possess the dwelling places that are not theirs.

Hab 2:1 I will stand upon my watch, and set me upon the tower, and will watch to see what HE will say unto me, and what I shall answer when I am reproved.

Hab 2:2 And the LORD answered me, and said, Write the vision, and make it plain upon tables, that he may read that readeth it.

Hab 2:3 For the vision is yet for an appointed time, but at the end it shall speak, and not lie: though it tarry, wait for it; because it will surely come, it will not tarry.

Hab 2:5 and Note: description of hell, Sheol, etc.

Hab 2:6 ... Woe unto him that increaseth that which is not his.

Habakkuk cont.

Hab 2:14 For the earth shall be filled with the knowledge of the Glory of the LORD, as the waters cover the sea.

Hab 2:20 But the LORD is in HIS Holy Temple: let all the earth keep silence before HIM.

Hab 3:1 A prayer of Habakkuk the prophet upon Shigionoth.

Hab 3:1-2 The prophet beseeches GOD for his people.

Hab 3:3-15 He calls to mind former deliverances.

Hab 3:16-19 His firm trust in the Divine Mercy.

Hab 3:1 (note) Comparison of O.T. and N.T. Prayer.

Hab 3:17-19 Even through suffering and loss, the prophet will remain faithful.

Hab 3:18 Yet I will rejoice in the LORD, I will joy in the GOD of my salvation.

Hab 3:19 The LORD GOD is my strength, and HE will make my feet like hinds feet and HE will make me to walk upon mine high places. To the chief singer on my stringed instruments.
