

Genesis cont. 24

Gen 35: 2-5 Jacob puts away idols from his family.

Gen 35: 6 So Jacob came to Lu2, which is in the land of Canaan, that is Beth-el, he and all the people that were with him.

Gen 35: 7 And he built there an altar, and called the place El-beth-el: because there GOD appeared unto him when he fled from the face of his brother.

Gen 35: 9-15 GOD appears to Jacob again

Gen 35: 10 GOD renames Jacob to Israel

Gen 35: 11 And GOD said unto him:

I AM GOD ALMIGHTY: be fruitful and multiply; a nation and a company of nations shall be of thee, and kings shall come out of thy loins;

Gen 35: 12 And the land which I gave Abraham and Isaac, to thee I will give it, and to thy seed after thee will I give this land.

Gen 35: 8 Pehorah, Rebekah's nurse dies.

Gen 35: 16-20 Rachel dies in childbirth of Benjamin.

Gen 35: 28-29 Isaac dies at age 180 years.

Genesis cont. 26

Gen 40: 1-19 Joseph interprets the dreams of Pharaoh's Chief Butler and Chief Baker.

Gen 40: 10-15 Joseph foresees the Butler returned to Pharaoh as before.

Gen 40: 17-19 Joseph foresees the Baker is to be hanged.

Gen 40: 20-22 The predictions come true.

Gen 40: 23 Yet did not the chief butler remember Joseph, but forgot him.

Gen 40: 8 Joseph tells them that interpretations of dreams belong to GOD.

Gen 41: 1-8 Pharaoh has two dreams, which no one can tell the meaning.

Gen 41: 9-13 The chief butler tells Pharaoh of Joseph.

Gen 41: 16 And Joseph answered Pharaoh, saying, it is not in me: GOD shall give Pharaoh an answer of peace.

Gen 41: 17-24 Pharaoh tells of the two dreams: Seven good king followed and eaten by Seven evil king - Then Seven good ears of corn followed and destroyed by seven withered ears of corn.

Gen 41: 25 And Joseph said unto Pharaoh, the dream of Pharaoh is one: GOD has showed Pharaoh what HE is about to do.

Genesis cont. 25

Gen 35: 29 Esea and Jacob bury Isaac.

Gen 36 The generations of Esaau, who is Edom.

Gen 37: 1-4 Joseph is loved by Jacob, but hated by his brothers. Jacob makes him a coat of many colours.

Gen 37: 5-17 Joseph has dreams that portray him as ruler over his family.

Gen 37: 18-27 ... they conspired to slay Joseph and threw him into a pit.

Gen 37: 28 Joseph is sold for 20 pieces of silver.

Gen 37: 36 And the Midianites sold him into Egypt unto Potiphar, an officer of Pharaoh's, and captain of the guard.

Gen 38 Tamar plays the harlot and deceives Judah.

Gen 39: 1-6 Joseph becomes the leader of Potiphar's house.

Gen 39: 7-19 Potiphar's wife tempts Joseph and falsely accuses him.

Gen 39: 20-22 Potiphar imprisons Joseph. The LORD helps Joseph who gains favor and is placed in charge of all prison activities.

Gen 39: 23 The LORD causes Joseph to prosper.

Genesis cont. 27

Gen 41: 29-30 Joseph foretells of 7 years of plenty followed by 7 years of famine.

Gen 41: 33-49 Pharaoh appoints Joseph over all of Egypt. Food is gathered and stored for 7 years, the fifth part is saved.

Gen 41: 56-57 Famine is over all the Earth, and all people come to Joseph to buy corn.

Gen 42: 1-5 Jacob sends 10 sons to Egypt to buy corn, for the famine was in Canaan.

Gen 42: 6-8 The sons of Israel appear before Joseph, who was governor in Egypt. Joseph recognizes his brethren, but they knew not him.

Gen 42: 9-38 Joseph sends his brethren home with corn. He holds his brother Simeon captive for them to return with Benjamin, Joseph's brother.

Gen 43 Israel finally agrees to send Benjamin to Egypt for the famine was sore in the land.

Gen 43: 33-34 His brethren dine with Joseph.

Gen 44: 1-2 Joseph commands his Steward to fill his brother's sacks with food and their money. Also the silver cup is placed in Benjamin's sack.
